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How To UnClog A Toilet Bowl

Toilet bowls, like all other drains, often become clogged. An excessive amount of toilet tissue or a diaper accidentally flushed can be the culprit. We know of an absent minded young mother who did a double reverse. Her son, it seems, had soiled his diaper. Off came the lad's trousers, then the diaper. With her boy's unclean garments in hand, mama walked into the bathroom, threw the diaper into the hamper, and flushed the trousers down the toilet! Anyway, we're sure you'll find this recipe unique.

Utensils

Ball-type plunger

Ingredients

Liquid bleach Powdered soap Petroleum jelly

Approximate Time: 20 To 30 Minutes

- 1. Fill bucket with tap water.
- 2. Pour water into toilet bowl.
- 3. Repeat two or three times.
- 4. Pour 2 to 3 cups of bleach and 1 cup of soap powder into bowl.
- 5. Pour water into bowl and let stand. In a short time, the chemical action of the soap and bleach will break the clog.
- 6. If clog is not entirely broken, a plunger must be used.
- 7. Lubricate entire lip circumference of plunger with petroleum jelly as shown in Figure 77A.
- 8. Depress plunger slowly and jerk up rapidly (Fig. 77B).
- 9. Repeat as necessary.
- 10. After use, clean plunger thoroughly.


