## **How To Repair Pinholes in Pipes**


This is the least troublesome repair to make on a leaky pipe. A pinhoie just can't create a big hassle: a squirt here and there, but certainly not a flood. So be calm as you perform this simple task.

## Ingredients

Box of round toothpicks

## **Approximate Time: 10 To 15 Minutes**




Figure 89. **How To Repair Pinholes in Pipe**

- 1. Locate pinhoie in pipe (Fig. 89A). It is not necessary, for this recipe, to shut off water supply, though some find it desirable.
- 2. Push toothpick as far as possible into pinhole (Fig. 89B).
- 3. If you have shut off water supply, you may now turn it back on.
- 4. The leak may persist for several moments, but it will cease once the toothpick has expanded in the hole.
- 5. Call plumber when time allows, but not on weekends or holidays.
